The only set back was a considerable absence of good rain impacting on forest growth and creating forest fire hazard. As every summer the Picnic was the highlight event for the campers and their guests and, as for so many years, the weather cooperated fully. Picnic is the time to enjoy, reconnect and reflect, make new friends, take part in TLCASD activities but above all Picnic is for our children, grandchildren, nephews, nieces, other relatives and children of our guests. It is an immense pleasure to watch their faces, from the youngest to teenagers, as they take part in activities such as Fish pond, Land races, Golf shoot, Canoe and Swimming races. These are the days that they will cherish in their memories forever. As so many other campers I now watch my grandchildren take part and remember our children doing the same thing more than 25 years ago. Another generation of Trout Lakers is growing up and learning, not only the joy of being the camper, but also the responsibility for preserving this lake for the next and the next and so on generation. As usual, TLCASD tent has been busy and well attended. We were selling Lottery, Art draw tickets and clothing, collecting memberships, having display on environment and latest forestry harvest maps. Ever popular Membership prize draw also took place there. Although we sold \$ 500 worth of tickets less, the main Lottery was a success because second prize - a beautiful quilt was donated by Michele Myre. This substantially reduced our cost. For the first time we run Art Draw and this brought some extra revenue. I want to thank all art donors - their names are listed elsewhere. Our membership grew again, and at mid-November stood at an all-time high of 205 with some more to come in. Almost 83% of all property owners belong to our Association but our goal of signing all owners remains.

In closing, I would like to comment on some new wildlife sighting in Trout Lake area. As we all know regular sightings of moose, bear, beaver, deer, rabbits, partridge, squirrels, chipmunks, groundhogs, large number of bird species, and occasional sightings of wolf, coyote, mink, skunk and otter are common. In the last Bulletin a first sighting of Massasauga rattler was reported. I can also report that we have a picture of Lynx resting in the snow just of Cherriman road last winter, and that a cougar was spotted previous summer, as well as cougar tracks were seen last winter on Shaw road. These sightings were on North shore. I imagine that some people are being somewhat uneasy about these animals and reptiles. I can only say that I and my family, like so many northerners, have spent countless days in the bush hiking, fishing, hunting or plainly enjoying the scenery. I have encountered, totally unintentionally, a bear and a wolf fairly close perhaps only few meters away. As I stood there both animals simply walked away. At no time I have been threatened by them or any other animal or reptile. These sightings indicate to me that our unobtrusive behavior has made these creatures comfortable in our surrounding. It tells me that we can, if we want to, behave in such a way as not to disturb and destroy the habitat that supports them. I will leave with a quote from a very good movie about the animals in Africa " If you don't bother them, they will not bother you"

It has been a very busy year for safety. I will list the major jobs that were done this year .

1- ordered and installed 5 new solar markers.

2- Made and installed 2 new floating strobe lights. This involved 2 weeks of fabricating ,painting and working in my garage, then with the help of Bob Nikolic and his Son we took my boat and installed them. They work very nice .

3- With the help of Paul Chartrand and Paul Fyfe we removed that very large scoop tram tire in front of MacKay's

cottage. This job alone took 3 full days, a lot of hard work and ½ tank of fuel from my jeep. There was a lot of sweat and beers but we made it happen. I could not have asked for better guys to work with.

4- Installed 3 new markers and one floating bottle .

5- Delivered a new water pump to Silvery Moon Lodge.

Professionally installed septic system will protect lake water quality. However they will not process paints, solvents, oils, lubricants etc. If you put these into the septic system, the chemicals will reach the lake.

By using fully biodegradable cleaners, soaps, detergents and shampoos, you will further protect lake water. However, remember that these products must stay in soil for 30 days to biodegrade.

TLCASD Director Fishery Report Fall 2010

Hello, everyone. During the summer I have done some maintenance items around the fish pond. New locks were purchased and placed on the pipes and steel container. Old locks are in my possession for use if needed. Inventory of all equipment has been taken along with the photographs for proof, and serial number of the transfer pump included. The bottom of the pond was cleaned up as well as clipping of the tall grass and weeds to prevent fingerlings being trapped when draining pond to transfer fish to the lake.

I intend to make permanent signs making people aware of the fish pond and the hazards around it. This will provide for safety and remove our liability in case of unfortunate accident, and I want to make safety first priority. Plans are in the works for our first Annual TLCASD fish fry put together by Fishery Committee in

collaboration with Noelville branch of Knights of

Columbus, to be held August 20/21, 2011 at their campground. The details will be announced later.

TLCASD Forestry Committee Report Fall 2010

During the summer the Forestry Committee was involved in two activities. The Harvest Map for the next 10 years forestry harvest around Trout Lake was displayed and detail questions by the interested campers were answered by Committee members. On August 28th members and others attended an organized one day tour of the nearby forest area with Doug Maki, Silvicultural Forester with VFM. During the tour Doug explained Sudbury District forest organizational set up re: logging companies, forest composition, harvest, reforestation and other activities. VFM (Vermilion Forest Management Company) is formed and financed by 9 partner logging companies that harvest the trees in Sudbury District. The Board of Directors is composed of the representatives of these logging companies. The local partner companies that harvest around our lake are: Lahaie Lumber Ltd. and H&R Chartrand Lumber Ltd. Another partner with harvest rights nearby is GP Northwoods which recently bought out Grant Forest Products, who had earlier bought the Fryer Forest Products share in VFM. GP has made arrangements for Domtar to manage the harvest of these blocks. Fryer Forest Products is now an 'independent operator' with a small harvest allocation.

The forest around Trout Lake area is varied but the most valuable harvested products are stands of white and red pine. To be classified as a white pine stand, the area must contain at least 30% white and red pine trees. On average, in the Sudbury Forest, white pine stands are composed of 40% white and 10% red pine.

VFM employs a two-cut or three-cut shelter wood harvest system in these pine stands. For both systems, the objective of the first cut is to remove most of the non-pine species (leaving a few large poplar for cavity-nesting creatures) and defective pines so that the better quality pine remain well-spaced to provide a seed source and 40 - 50 % shade on the forest floor.

The two-cut approach is used in stands where there is a smaller number of large-topped pine that remain to provide the shade and seed. These areas are treated with herbicide to knock back the vigorous flush of poplar, maple, and brush species that is stimulated by harvesting. This is necessary to give the 10 cm tall white and red pine seedlings that are planted a chance to get established. This also gives seeds dropped from the trees on site a chance to germinate and grow. As seen in the photo, the brush species do re-establish naturally, but the young pine get a good hold on the site. The second cut is done when the young pine have reached a height of about 6 m which will take 15 to 20 years.

The three-cut approach is used in stands with a higher component of pine where the more crowded growing conditions result in a larger number of smaller-topped pines remaining to provide shade and seed. Natural regeneration from the local seed is more dependable in three-cuts, but herbicide is still required to give the pine a chance at renewal. Sometimes the ground is intentionally scratched up by dragging heavy chains behind a skidder to provide better germination conditions. Once the renewed pine is 30 cm tall (5-7 years), a second harvest is done. The third and final harvest is done when the renewal is 6 m tall.

VFM also employs clear cut and modified clear cut around the lake, however as a result of latest negotiations between TLCASD, VFM and MNR no clear cut is employed within 200 m (approx. 600 ft.) from the lake shore line. In addition there will be no spraying of herbicides within 120 m (approx. 400 ft.) from the shoreline and an additional 120 m no spray zone behind cottage lots.


There were many questions on all forestry issues asked by the members that took the tour. On behalf of the TLCASD I also indicated that we are opposed to the VFM being governed by the lumber companies (kind of fox in charge of the chicken coop) and that we submitted a proposal to Ontario government that the VFM Board be composed of reps of Logging companies, MNR and public. This would ensure the complete freedom of VFM foresters to apply the best harvest practices in Sudbury Forest.

The tour was attended by Committee members: Dave and Barb Moxham, Bill Munro and I. Other campers that attended were: Margaret Richer (TLCASD Treasurer), Jean-Yves (John) Losier (Dir. Without Port.), Carol Munro (member of Auditing Committee), Ljuba Nikolic (Director Membership) and TLCASD members: Juliette (Julie) Losier, Kevin and Aaron Stacey. At the end of the tour, as a token of appreciation and gratitude for this excellent tour, Doug was presented the TLCASD ball cap.

The latest information on forest activities is that Fryer Forest Products is harvesting an area beyond Judge Lake on north side and far away from our lake. Shaw road signs warning about logging trucks haulage are properly posted and operation should be over before year end. H&R Chartrand Lumber plans to cut a white pine area north of Lafreniere Road between Christmas and March using the same winter road used by Fryer in 2002.
