Hello everyone. 2011 March was a totally different story than last year. We came home, after wandering around India for seven weeks, on March 1 and eager to enjoy another warm and sunny month just as we did last year and so many other years. It was sunny all right but the temperature dipped to -25C the night we came home! Remembering the old adage about March "in like a lion....." we knew that the weather will turn nice. Well, it didn't. Pretty well entire March was cold, cloudy and snowy – we got about 20 + cm in a single day. As I write this on April 5, the high is +3 and there is at least 40 cm of good ice on the lake!

Back to TLCASD business, your Board of Directors held its third and the final meeting in 2010 on December 4th. Among routine matters and approval of standard expenditures such as Bulletin, the Board adopted 2011 budget with predicted Revenues of \$ 14,100 and Expenditures of \$ 14,800 essentially maintaining our solid financial position. We are again planning larger expenditures on environment and continuing larger expenditures on safety. On environmental front we want to do extra sampling for phosphorus in shallow bays in order to prevent occurrence of blue-green algae bloom, and safety wise complete conversion to solar lights. We also plan to keep installing more markers on the sites we drilled two years ago.

The first Board meeting this year was held on April 2nd, during which we reviewed the activities of previous year and the plans for the current year. We had another good year on financial front; the Revenue exceeded expenditures by \$ 970, however the payment for printing the last Bulletin was done this year. Of the programs Safety expenditures were quite high because we purchased one new fire pump. We will closely monitor performance of all fire pumps and continue replacing when necessary. On the Revenue side our advertising take was highest ever thanks to Directors effort and improved quality of the bulletin. I would like to thank Board of Directors for their exemplary efforts to raise the Revenue and prudent spending that resulted in this financial success. I also want to express gratitude to our members for their continuing support of our work. The Board approved running of Lottery again and some beautiful prizes are there to be won.

The place and date for Corporation Annual meeting, Picnic and Fish Fry have been set and the Board look forward seeing you there. As per our By-Law No. 1 you will, or already have, receive official invitation to attend Annual meeting; for now jot down May 28, July 31 and August 21 on your calendar.

2010 phosphorus samples result are now posted on Ontario Lake Partner web site and I am very happy to tell you that these are lower than two previous years. The average phosphorus for the whole lake is 6.3 mg per liter as compared to 2008-6.5 and 2009-6.9. While these results are encouraging it is important to remember that the Board of Directors has set the target, under the OUR LAKE-OUR FUTURE program, to 6.0 mgl/L by 2013. I want to congratulate all Trout Lakers on this achievement but, please remain vigilant.

On the sober note, our Director Safety Chris Carrier resigned from the Board due to the job commitment. Chris joined the Board as a Director without Portfolio in July 2008 and eventually took over Safety program. Chris spearheaded conversion to solar lights and built first two floating lights on the lake. He also helped with fishery, garbage clean up and organized removal of large tire from the lake. He will continue to take care of a number of markers and lights in area close to his and Diane's house. TLCASD will miss his big contribution to the safety program.

I would also like to address an ongoing problem around Trout Lake. Somewhere else in this Bulletin you will read about Dodd Lake clean up. This is not an isolated incident; it seems that we can find garbage everywhere along the shoreline and in the water, along the roads and in the bush. Unless we stop the accumulation of this garbage it will start affecting eco system and water quality. While it is true that a lot of this garbage is disposed by fishermen, hunters and visitors to the Trout Lake area, I suspect that some Trout Lakers are also involved. TLCASD Board of Directors is determined to keep this area clean and will establish the strategy to deal with garbage problem. In the mean time, please make sure that we, as members of TLCASD, show by example that throwing the garbage all over the place is not acceptable behavior around our lake.

In closing, I wish all Campers healthy, safe and enjoyable season.

TLCASD DIRECTOR FISHERY REPORT

Spring 2011

Good day all

Just to start by re-capping last years events, I began my first term as Director of Fisheries and got implicated bit by bit helping out at the pond, meeting new people on the lake and finding out that many are quite enthused about the fish in our lake. A number of people help out year after year either by helping to maintain our pond keeping the bottom in good order as to ensure the maximum return of fingerlings to the lake, gathering the milk and the eggs in the spring, transporting the fingerlings to our pond at whatever time of day or night it may be, feeding the fingerlings with a blend of food which changed through the years with our knowledge and knowledge of others, once the rearing period is complete others help safely get all of the remaining fingerlings out of the pond and into the lake at proper locations.

We cannot emphasize enough the importance of keeping the bottom of the pond in ideal condition as to maximize our return to the lake because aside from predators such as turtles and herons feeding on the fingerlings human carelessness also has a huge impact. Last year there were tire tracks in the bottom of the pond which we had to rake over to fill not to leave any depressions in the pond where fingerlings may become entrapped upon draining. The purpose here is to educate not to insult our people as we know it may be thrilling to drive down into the muddy pond but foremost it is a safety hazard, has a negative impact on our success, is intrusive and creates more work for the care takers of the pond. With this being said this action should become something of the past. Thanks for your participation and cooperation.

Please help by keeping out!

Through the past year I've also had the pleasure of meeting with and talking to wonderful people at the Ministry of Natural Resources whom assisted with filling out paper work necessary to obtain our \$1000.00 dollar grant to cover certain costs implicated with the pond's operation.

At the end of the season we had some safety signs ordered for the pond to make people more aware and promote safety as our first priority.

In the early part of 2011 sign posts were ordered to mount our signs once the ground has thawed and time permits. Application has also already been sent for approval to the Ministry for this year's project. Part of which include rearing the fingerlings and also possibly starting out discussions around erecting a fence around the pond.

Through our Trout Lake fish fry it is our intention to gather property owners from every shore. Aside from being a fund raiser it will be the perfect opportunity to meet and mingle with neighbours from all around our lake.

We will only be printing 300 tickets which will be pre-sold at the beginning of July to Trout Lake property owners only and guests they might have over that weekend. All

tickets must be sold by the end of July. For reservations call or e-mail at numbers listed below , hope to see there .

Aside from condiments, your plate will consist of fish, fries, coleslaw and homemade beans. The price per ticket is \$15.00 each.

The entire proceeds of our fish fry will go to Trout Lake Fisheries. The funds will go towards the purchase of fencing to be installed around the perimeter of the entire pond, keeping predators away from our fingerlings resulting in a better return to our lake.

Spring has finally arrived and the pickerel season is now closed giving them peace and love before the spawn. Hope everyone is anxious and eager to help make 2011 another year of success for the fish in Trout Lake. After all I wouldn't want to let Roy and Sharon down.

Finally thanks to everyone for all their time, efforts, opinions and suggestions as well as money everyone spends being part of an association we can all be proud of.

New 2011 Annual Schedule is out and there are two items related to Trout Lake. One is that Chartrand plans to cut the block behind Lafreniere (Trout lake east) Road which they did not cut past winter and that VFM plans aerial spraying in Chartrand block south of Silv'ry Moon Road. We will have to make sure that aerial spraying does not come close to the lake or the water course that drains into the lake.

TLCASD ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT

Spring 2011 Environmental Report

Greetings to all Campers. I would like to start this report by very good news on environmental front. Results of 2010 phosphorus sampling are now posted on Ontario Lake Partner site (www.gov.on.ca/environment/en/local/lakepartnerprogram/index than click on Data and resources). The good news is that 2010 Trout Lake (Hoskin) six sites average phosphorus is 6.3 mgl/L, which is lower than last three years average. It appears that our actions in preventing blue-green algae blooms are starting to show results. While this is a very good news it is important to remember that we must remain as vigilant as ever in protecting our lake because it does not take much to reverse positive trend. For example Trout Lake average 1995-2001 was 6.4 mgl/L, however 2002-2004 average skyrocketed to 9.6 mgl/L. Also remember that under the OUR LAKE-OUR FUTURE project we are aiming for 6.0 mgl/L target in 2013.

Our plan this year includes, as always, Lake Partner sampling program and another effort to sample shallow bays. We will make an effort to introduce some signage reminding people of environmental issues. We now have new Environmental Committee members: Bill Munro, Jenifer Adams, Michelle Zettler, Ljuba Nikolic, Dave and Barb Moxham and myself. I am looking forward to work with the Committee for ensure the maximum protection of our lake.


