

The President's Report

Slobodan (Bob) Nikolic

Greetings to all Trout Lakers. This is the last time that I will write to you as your President. Almost two years ago I informed the Board that I wanted to step down from the President's position, however I kept going on hoping that the Board would appoint new person. At this point in time I am not sure who will take over after I leave the position on January 1, 2014. I do intend to stay in Forestry and as Past President and will help new President and TLCASD as much as I can.



Before I take a look back to 2007, I want to emphasize that all the changes and improvements that have happened during these years were the result of a dedicated Trout lakers, from Executives on TLCA Board to Directors of TLCASD Corporation and to many volunteers on various committees. Without their hard work, none of this would have happened. We started regular meetings at least three times a year. The first order of business in 2007 was to incorporate the Association in order to protect all volunteers on Association business and to get back the lottery license lost three years before. After quite a bit of work on By-Law No.1, Executives approved the first draft and presented it at the meeting of members. Prior to this meeting, all members had received a copy of the by-law and many changes were adopted at the meeting and that made this document much better. The final decision to incorporate was made at AGM in 2008. Subsequently, in 2009 we obtained lottery license raising extra funds for our programs.

One of the important efforts in the beginning was to establish proper financial procedures for association business. We started making yearly budgets as a guideline to how much revenue we would receive and on which programs the money would be spent on. Every expenditure had to be approved by the Board of Directors either at the meeting or by email to be later confirmed by proper motion at the meeting. An Auditing Committee, established by By-Law No. 1, reviews all financial transactions twice a year and reports its findings to the membership. This committee also suggests improvements in financial procedures. On the organizational side, we tried to obtain a land use permit to establish picnic grounds close to the public landing on south shore. Having only Happy Landing lodge as the place for the Picnic, we thought that having an alternative site would be a good idea. Unfortunately, MNR would not allow any new development on crown land. In order to keep and save all our belongings and documents in one place, this year we purchased a used travel trailer and it's parked at Happy Landing. Since 2007 all of our records are also in electronic form and perhaps one day we will scan all old records. Our Bulletin has been improved year after year and the extra cost was covered by tripling the advertising dollars.

On the environmental front, we made big strides in water quality improvements that resulted in total Phosphorus values declining from 7-8 μ /l (micrograms per litter) few years back to 6 and lower recently. We are also making an effort to reduce the amount of garbage around and in the lake. We also made big improvements to Fish Pond and our Fishery program continues to raise pickerel fingerlings successfully. Our Forestry Committee managed to make big improvements in regulating forestry practices around the lake such as increasing no cut buffers around the lake and roads, and establishing a 200 m no spraying zone around the lake and

behind camps. During last 6 years our membership increased every year to an all-time high of 220 in 2012. This may be the level that will be difficult to increase and maintain.

On the safety front we added 7 markers and replaced all lights on markers with solar units eliminating about \$500 in battery costs. We also purchased three new fire pumps and expanded their coverage on the lake. Most important of all I believe that we managed to strengthen sense of companionship that Trout Lake is famous for. Adding the annual Fish Fry we introduced this get together for adult campers as well. Looking back I am very satisfied with what TLCASD, with joint effort of the Board of Directors and its members, has achieved last few years. I am also confident that it will continue with its work for many more years in the future.

All of our programs have been again carried out this year as usual. There are some new initiatives in the offing starting this year. The most important are two of them: decision by the Board to issue a memory book of the history of Trout Lake and the Association as part of the 60th anniversary celebration, and to create a beautiful large lake map with a lot of information other than safety, such as bays, islands and road names. These will be costly and we may have to either look for advertising or to sell the items. Another effort will see a new line of merchandise related to the anniversary. There could be a new effort to revive Spring dance that used to be a big hit long time ago.

All in all we can look towards TLCASD future with enthusiasm and optimism.

Bob Nikolic for his continuous help and support with absolutely everything and anything. Thanks Bob!


Last, but for sure, not least, Thanks to each and every camper that takes the time and effort to keep this lake safe.

FISHERY REPORT

There are two applications left to submit to OFAH in December: Reimbursement for Operating expenses and also Capital expenses. The Operating grant should cover all expenses we incurred this year in rearing and releasing pickerel fingerlings, while we used the Capital grant to upgrade the road. Unfortunately, these days \$ 1,000 does not go very far in road work but some work is better than none. The road was widened and graded to eliminate ruts that collect water and create muddy sections in spring.

The Fishery Director position is vacant and it needs to be filled, otherwise next year's program may not proceed. There are a fair number of people on the Fishery Committee that can take the position, so please advise anyone on the Board of Directors if you are willing to help. Thank you to all the volunteers who make this program such a success.

Mosquitoes Hate Wind

A friend of mine shared these thoughts with me well worth the read. He joined some friends for a barbecue in their backyard. The guests were lively and the space was lovely - grassy and open but shady and surrounded by lots of shrubs and trees.

In other words, it was perfect for mosquitoes - and indeed, closer inspection showed that they were thriving in all that greenery.

But our friends had come up with a solution that saved us from having to deal with bug repellents or, worse, bites and itches. On a low table, they set up a small electric fan, perhaps 12 inches high, that swept back and forth, sending a gentle breeze across the grassy area where people were sitting.

That was it. No citronella candles, no bug zappers, no DEET, nothing expensive or high-tech. Yet amazingly, it worked. As far as I could tell, no mosquitoes flew into the vicinity of the simulated wind; nobody was bitten.

As we left, I asked our hosts about the fan idea; they credited a mutual friend at the barbecue. He, in turn, paid tribute to a friend of his: Frank Swift, president of Swift Food Equipment Inc. in Philadelphia.

So I reached out to Mr. Swift, who replied by e-mail. "The solution came from trying to think like a bug," he explained, "and realizing I don't like flying into a 15 m.p.h. wind."

Outsmarting bugs with a fan may be a poorly known strategy. But the method, it turns out, is endorsed by the American Mosquito Control Association, a nonprofit group based in Mount Laurel, N.J., that publishes a journal bearing its name.

"Mosquitoes are relatively weak fliers, "it says on its Web site," so placing a large fan on your deck can provide a low-tech solution." The group says mosquitoes fly slowly - from roughly 1 to 1.5 miles per hour, depending on the species.

Scientists have identified another factor. The breeze from a fan disperses the human emanations that allow female mosquitoes to zero in on us. (The guys are innocent! Honest! Females need the stolen blood for egg making.)

Humans exhale lots of carbon dioxide - the most widely recognized of the many likely mosquito attractants, including body heat and odors. When a female mosquito senses the invisible gas, she typically flies a

zigzag path within the plume to track down its source.

In a wetland swarming with mosquitoes, entomologists from Michigan State University did an experiment that demonstrated not only the attractive power of a carbon dioxide trap but the

effectiveness of plume disruption.

"Fan-generated wind strongly reduced the mosquito catches," the scientists wrote in The Journal of Medical Entomology. "We recommend that fangenerated wind should be pursued as a practical means of protecting humans or pets from mosquitoes in the backyard setting."

The recommendation has penetrated the blogosphere - a bit. "Sit near an electric fan while you are outside," <u>eHow.com</u> advises. "An oscillating fan works best, but a regular box fan will do. Mosquitoes aren't strong enough to fly through the wind."

In my experience, that kind of homey advice is lost amid all the ads and pitches for mosquito repellents and traps, which can cost hundreds of dollars.

As for other popular remedies, the mosquito control association says repellent-infused mosquito coils provide only "some protection" at best, and it dismisses the candles with a shrug, saying their mild repellent action offers no significant advantage over other candles that give off lots of smoke.

By contrast, the simple fan seems like a sure thing. In the world of high-tech, we call this news you can use.








