The President's Report

Greetings to all campers!

Hello everyone. It was somewhere in Southeast Asia that I had visited Ontario Lake Partner program website for umpteenth time to see if the 2012 phosphorus sample values have been posted and that evening they were. I scrolled down to Trout Lake-Hoskin and scanned numbers but they were quite low so I checked



twice and put them on the paper. To say that I was elated when I saw the average for the lake would have been an understatement. I expected the average to be close to 6 milligrams per liter, our goal for 2013, but not 5.5! As you will see on the graph somewhere else in the Bulletin this was continuation of the downward trend in last few years. While stand-alone one year results are not significant, when the low values are part of the trend they become quite significant.

At the beginning of March we returned home hoping to enjoy some nice weather but this year was different. Cold and snowy March reminded us of 70's winters, when it was normal for ice to leave the lakes end of April or beginning of May. It is now mid-April and there is plenty of ice on the lake.

The Board of Directors had its first meeting, including all Committees, on the 6th of April. This is the meeting at which, besides routine matters, the Board reviews previous year and make firm plans for the current year. Financially we had another successful year and maintained our sound monetary position. The Auditing Committee has reviewed financial books and found everything in order. The 2013 Budget should continue to maintain this trend. All programs will continue as in the past, with at least one new fire pump location to be added on the lake. In light of changing climate and new advances in research, the Board decided to push for completion of the lake environmental study and try to get MNR to do a fishery assessment in order to get the picture of fish species and their distribution. The last assessment was done 13 years ago and another one is certainly due. On these studies the Board hopes to partner with MNR and other institutions and look for grants because we cannot bear the cost of this work. A new committee was struck to deal with new Not-for Profit incorporation Act that will require changes to our By-Law No. 1.

The TLCASD Annual Membership meeting will be held on Saturday, June 1st, at 10:00 AM at Happy Landing Lodge. By the time you read this you will have received the invitation. There is proposal to change Article 22 in order to make it easier for former members to rejoin TLCASD. Please, plan to attend and take part in important discussions.

I wish all Campers a healthy, safe and enjoyable season.

The above table shows total phosphorus values at six sampling sites from 2007 to 2012.

The results indicate that on every sampling site total phosphorus shows a decline in last four years which is the period TLCASD launched Our Lake-Our Future Project. What is also significant is that all sites in 2012 had total phosphorus value at 6.0 or lower.

The lake average phosphorus declined from 6.6 in 2009 to 6.3 in 2010, to 6.2 in 2011 and to 5.5 last year. The results are nothing short of spectacular and it is to the credit of all Trout Lake Campers that have made an exemplary effort to minimize input of phosphorus into the water, therefore CONGRATULATIONS are in order.


However, we now need to make sure we stay below 6.0 in 2013 and think where we want to be in next five years. Perhaps, its advisable to set the goal of being at 5.5 μ /lit or below in next five years. T his would definitely exclude any possibility of having a blue-green algae bloom in our lake. Below are all Our Lake-Our Future Statements published in our Bulletin. Please, review them and try to adhere to the actions prescribed and we are confident that we will stay at 6.0 μ /lit or lower phosphorus in 2013!

It appears that we all know what has to be done so that lake stays clean and we just have to keep doing it.



So How Do You Create a Healthy Shoreline?

The easiest way, is it leave it as natural as possible. If it's too late and the natural vegetation has been altered, plant a buffer strip along the shoreline. A buffer strip provides wildlife habitat, filters run -off water, reduces soil erosion, increases biodiversity and adds value to your property. Use native plants and shrubs along this strip.

Don't remove dead tree stumps, logs and branches from the banks. Driftwood can be used in aesthetically pleasing ways as well.

Maintain your lawn naturally. Over-seed the grass to crowd out weeds. Use grass clippings, fallen leaves, compost or phosphate-free fertilizers to add nutrients to the lawn. OR remove as much manicured lawn as possible, to make way for native plants to grow. Native plants require much less maintenance and deter geese.

Plant trees and shrubs. Cattails are your friend. They help filter contaminants from the soil. The root systems of trees and shrubs hold the soil and prevent it from washing into the lake. Erosion and sedimentation can damage fish spawning areas. Do not "build" beaches where none exist. Beaches form naturally and tend to stay where they form. Attempting to create a new beach does not take into account natural water currents, which will wash away any beach sand which is deposited. If a beach is desired, you must make application to the Ministry of Natural Resources for a Work Permit. The recommended material for a beach is pea gravel. This gravel does not wash away.

Work Permits are also required if you are planning on building a retaining wall, boat launch, docks over 15 sq. meters in area, boathouses over water, and so on. In all cases, shoreline work best practices require you to install siltation control measures while the work is being undertaken. It is always advisable to do work on dry land, rather than in the water. It is illegal to try to extend your property out into the water, by placing fill beyond the natural shoreline.

The most environmentally friendly type of dock is a floating dock. Care must be taken, however, that the right building materials are used. Do not use green pressure-treated lumber if it will be in the water, as the chemicals will leach out. If you must use this type of wood, build the dock completely on shore, seal the cut ends as required, and allow the dock to "weather" for a period of time before installing it. Better choices would be western red cedar, redwood, and eastern white cedar which do not rot as quickly. Another option is using plastic wood for the deck of your dock, but it is not as structurally strong for the frame of a dock. If a floating dock isn't an option, consider a dock with pole or pipe legs. These create a very small footprint on the bottom of the lake, and do minimal damage.

Use natural cleaning products indoors and out. Baking soda & vinegar work well. Keep pet waste from washing into the lake. Maintain your vehicle so oil isn't dripping. Avoid overloading your septic system with laundry & dishwashers. Stagger loads throughout the week. Have your septic tank pumped at least every three years. When handling gasoline and oil, ensure you are far away from the lake.

Remove invasive vegetation such as purple loosestrife. See websites for best practices in removing invasives, and proper disposal methods.

FISHERY REPORT



Good day fellow Trout Lakers. Signs of spring are finally here and I hope everyone is healthy and looking forward to some good times on the lake.



As the ice leaves the shore, your fisheries committee is anxiously awaiting warmer water temperatures and the conditions necessary for the Walleye spawn. Our pond was prepared last fall and is now ready for this year's fingerlings.

On Saturday April 13, 2013 a few of your committee members attended the United Walleye Club workshop held in Sudbury at the Radisson Hotel. This venue, organized and chaired by Rolly Frappier, was outstanding with each guest speaker sharing invaluable information. This workshop also gave us the opportunity to speak with some MNR staff, be introduced to new contact people, and share common interests.

In a letter from the MNR dated April 8, 2013 we learned that the community fisheries involvement program (CFWIP) which allocated funds for Fisheries in the past has now been replaced by two new programs: the Community Hatchery Program (CHP) and the Land Stewardship and Habitat Restoration Program (LSHRP)

The LSHRP will provide \$300 000 per year for Habitat Restoration and Land Stewardship projects and will be administered by the MNR. The CHP will provide \$250 000 per year to support volunteer community fish hatchery operations in Ontario. The MNR and the OFAH have entered into an agreement for OFAH to deliver the CHP on behalf of the ministry.

Simultaneously, the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (OFAH) sent us a letter informing us that they will be administering the CHP and they invited us to partner with them in this program.

Your Fisheries committee got busy gathering information and we learned that our pond operation did meet the criteria to apply for the CHP. We then responded to the letter from the OFAH, accepting their invitation and we look forward to a productive and successful relationship with their organization.

With the LSHRP deadline quickly approaching we felt it would be in our best interest to concentrate on the funding from the CHP for this year and perhaps explore other avenues in the future.

Preparations are underway to make this year's rearing successful and pleasurable for all. Your Fisheries Committee is a team of dedicated Trout Lake campers who share the same vision "Successful Fishing on Trout Lake". Each committee member welcomes the opportunity to discuss any questions or ideas you may have about the "Trout Lake Fisheries". Feel free to contact any member if you would like an update or if you have any questions about this year's operations.
