

Life Changing Contest

You may know the Watson family, Kyle and Paula, and their two boys, lan and Scott who are Trout Lakers. The twins both have cerebral palsy and have wheelchairs.

Earlier this year, the Local Heroes Campaign contest was run by the National Mobility Equipment Dealers Association, The Watsons were nominated and many thousands of votes, later, were declared the winners!

This van will provide a life-changing benefit for their family as it now means both boys in wheelchairs can be transported at the same time. "It means mobility and inclusion," said Kyle Watson. It will permit them to do camping trips and road trips, as well as day-to day outings and visits to their school. The van is an MV-1 the world's first purpose-built SUV-type wagon that can accommodate up to two wheelchairs, and possibly workers as well.

Kyle said, "This is like winning a lottery for us".

We definitely agree, and congratulate the Watsons and wish them the best of luck in the future.

The Fire Chief said that if the fire had been left to burn until his crews arrived, most likely the entire property would have burned.

Mr. Keast was very thankful and made it a point to attend the picnic to express his thanks to the Association and renewed his membership.


FISH FRY FUN!!!



ENVIRONMENT &
FORESTRY REPORT—
Bob Nikolic, Director



Greetings to all campers! We are now far into the fall season. Scientifically, fall ends on Dec. 21 every year but as all Canadians know by mid-November we do feel like it is the beginning of winter. Right now most of the leaves are down and some mornings there is frost on the ground. Pretty soon the temperatures will be below 0C most of the day.

On environmental matters, the last Sechi disc reading was done at the end of September and results sent in. We will probably have to wait until mid-February for 2014 Phosphorus results. The lake water level has been, due to the enormous amount of rain, exceptionally high all year. At this time the level resembles what would be the highest level in spring. During spring, summer and fall there was a continuous input of water from streams around the lake and possibly a high load of nutrients from swamps entering the lake. This may cause our Phosphorus level to stay the same as last year or even go higher. I would dare to say that increased Phosphorus values are not the result of campers activities. I see more and more properties are having proper waste disposal systems installed, from classic tank and field beds to modern all enclosed systems. This is bound to help water quality.

As far as Forestry activity is concerned we have received notice that Chartrand Lumber will be harvesting Block 75 which is accessed from Lafreniere road on the north side of east end of the lake. As usual we will be monitoring this harvest and do not expect any problems from this operator. The forest harvest around the lake has been at low level for last few years.

I have advised the Board of Directors that I recommend a merger of Environment and Forestry positions. In 2003 these matters have been under Environmental Chairperson but due to the large workload in Forestry, a new Forestry position was created. In the last few years, the work on Forestry has been at a fairly low level. This may be due to the fact that we have managed to establish proper criteria for harvest around the lake. The work we started in 2003 has resulted in much larger no harvest zones around the lake and incoming streams, as well as along access roads. At the same time, a no herbicide spraying area of 120 meters along the shore and behind cottage lots has been in force. During the last few years there has been little harvesting close to the lake and we expect that this will continue due to the fact that we convinced MNR and loggers that Trout Lake deserves extra protection. It is the only lake trout lake east of highway 69 and south of highway 17 in Sudbury district, not to mention having very good water quality and beautiful vistas. The MNR has frozen all further lot developments on the lake in order to protect the lake and its surroundings.
