



FISHERY COMMITTEE REPORT

Hi. This year I have taken on the Director of Fishery position. With the help of those involved on the Fishery Committee and other volunteers, I hope we can maintain or improve upon the fine work that they have done, this and many other years.

This year the Ministry has stocked our lake on two separate days and locations with about 2,500 trout at Owl's Nest Lodge and 2,700 trout around 16 inches and 4,000 about 6 inches long at Silv'ry Moon Lodge.

All of these trout were fin clipped, the right rear fin was removed. This means that if you catch a lake trout with both rear fins, it is probably either a naturally reproduced fish from one of the earlier stockings, or from one of the original natural trout that were and hopefully still are, in this lake. If you do manage to catch one of these, please contact me on the phone or by email. It is important that we know if the natural lake trout are reproducing in the lake.

Our own pickerel fish stocking program this year was very successful, with between 4-5,000 pickerel fry released on June 26th. This is the end result of many hours of work by the Fishery Committee and other volunteers.

How many hours? Well here is an idea.

Around 14 people volunteered

100 hours for netting, milking and delivering eggs to the hatchery

4 hours delivery from hatchery tour pond


Uncounted hours by the Wolseley Fishery Group who raise the eggs to the size when they can be transferred to the pond

150 hours for pond maintenance improvements including placing a rubber mat on the bottom and creating a containment system for draining the pond

Feeding the fish and final delivery to Trout Lake.

This is just the time spent working, and does not include many expenses for fuel, mileage and other donations made by these fine volunteers. I would like to thank all of these folks for their hard work and dedication. Please remember that fish in this lake are fun to catch and great to eat. However, please be responsible and respect the catch limits.

So good luck fishing and keep a couple now and then.

BUGS DRIVING YOU BATTY?? TRY BUILDING AND INSTALLING A BAT HOUSE

Installing a backyard bat house is a great way to demonstrate your commitment to nature. And your bat-tenants will pay you back with some wonderful benefits.

Bats are essential for maintaining healthy ecosystems. Most bats eat huge amounts of insects, including farm pests and many of the nasty bugs that harass outdoor gatherings. You'll also enjoy learning more about bats as you watch them come and go from the home you provided.

And homes are often in short supply for bats. Their populations are declining around the world, often because of disappearing habitat.

A set of free plans is included here. There are many different plans available on the web including through the Canadian Wildlife Federation.

BUILDING RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Inside should have horizontal grooves at least every ½" to ½" apart OR attach polyethylene plastic mesh with exterior staples all the way up the front and back on the inside of the house to ensure bats can hang comfortably
- Opening at the bottom of the house should be about ³/₄" to 1" wide to prevent predators from entering
- Use 2" width sides and a 1" strip of wood (predator guard) attached to the lower front panel to create the small opening
- Landing area should be at least 4"
- \bullet For temperature variation, add a ceiling just beneath the roof on the inside of the house and leave a ½" wide air vent about 6" above the opening
- Caulk the seams to keep bats warm and dry
- Put bat house together with galvanized screws to help prolong the life of the house
- Paint outside of bat house with non-toxic, black or brown latex paint if the house is not getting at least 6 hours of sunlight



BAT HOUSE BUILDING GUIDE



MATERIALS:

- ¾" to 1" thick extenor plywood or cedar.
- Gelvanized screws
- Silicone caulk.
- ½" to 3/8" staples
- 1/8" to %" polyethylene plastic mesh (aptional).
- Non-toxic, black or brown latex paint (optional).

FINISHED SIZE:

- At least 24" rell
- 13 14" wide
- 3" 4" deep

BUILDING RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Inside should have horizontal gripoves at least every
 %" to ½" apart OR attack polyethylene plastic
 mesh with exterior staples all the way up the front
 and back on the inside of the house to ensure bats
 can hang comfortably
- Opening at the bottom of the house should be about 44" to 1" wide to prevent predators from entering
- Use 2" width sides and a 1" strip of wood (prodator guard) ettached to the lower front panel to create the small opening
- Landing area should be at least 4*

- For temperature variation, add a ceiling just beneath the roof on the inside of the house and leave a ½" wide air vent about 6" above the opening
- Caulk the seams to keep bats warm and dry.
- Put bat house together with galvanized screws to help prolong the life of the house
- Paint ourside of bat house with non-taxic, black or brown latex paint if the house is not getting at least 6 hours of sunlight

- Place at least 15 ft. high
- Face south to southeast to gain exposure to at least 4 hours of direct sunlight
- Bat house should be free from obstructions with at least 20 ft, of open space around the bat house
- Mounting options: poles, garages, barns, human houses, or tall trees, making sure there are no obstacles to prevent bats from entering the bat house.
- Bat houses covered by leaves may take longer to become occupied because they are harder for the bats to find



Sunscreen safety tips (or how to avoid looking like a lobster)

Choose a high SPF. Protect your health by using a broad-spectrum <u>sunscreen</u> with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of at least 15. The sunscreen should also say "broad-spectrum" on the label, to screen out most of the UVA and UVB rays.



- Look for "water resistant." Look for claims on the label that the product stays on better in water (water resistant, very water resistant).
- **Read application instructions.** For best results, be sure to follow the instructions on the product label.
- Use lots of sunscreen. Use the recommended amount of sunscreen.
- **Apply it early.** Apply sunscreen 20 minutes before you go outside; reapply 20 minutes after going outside and at least every 2 hours after that. Use a generous amount. Cover exposed areas generously, including ears, nose, the tops of feet and backs of knees.
- **Reapply often.** Reapply <u>sunscreen</u> often to get the best possible protection especially if you are swimming or sweating heavily.
- **Protect yourself.** Sunscreen and insect repellents can be used safely together. Apply the sunscreen first, then the insect repellent.
- **Sunscreens and babies.** Do not put sunscreen on babies less than 6 months of age. Keep them out of the sun and heat as their skin and bodies are much more sensitive than an adult's.
- **Test for an allergic reaction.** Before using any tanning product on you or your child check for an allergic reaction, especially if you have sensitive skin. Apply it to a small patch of skin on the inner forearm for several days in a row. If the skin turns red or otherwise reacts, change products.



Other Sun-Safe Strategies

Stay in the shade

Wear a hat and long sleeved shirt


Wear sun-protective clothing (specially designed to reduce UV rays)

Be especially vigilant around water and snow—their reflective qualities can increase potential for a sunburn

Wear sunglasses to protect your eyes (even children)

Avoid exposure during high peak periods—10 a.m.—2 p.m.

Hope you have great the rest of summer and hope to see you at the Picnic.








FORESTRY REPORT—Bob Nikolic, Director

Dear Bob,

Thank-you for attending our Information Centre in Sudbury and discussing your observations with the Board of TLCASD.

We have received and reviewed the TLCASD letter (dated April 28, 2014), and I have the following responses to your requests:

- Block 2010-090 There are two parts of this block that are in close proximity to the south shore of Trout Lake: 1) a <u>contingency</u> allocation (west of the power line corridor), and 2) a <u>Term 2</u> allocation (east of the power line corridor). You have requested that the wetlands and streams that drain north into Trout Lake retain the same level of AOC protection as shown in the current approved 2010 FMP (i.e. a 15 m reserve + a 15 m modified AOC). VFM will ensure that the above noted AOCs will be updated to reflect the requested level of protection. This protection will be incorporated into the TL_AOC prescription.
- 2. Block 2010-075 This block is situated along the north shore of Trout Lake near the east end of the lake. You have requested that the originally shown AOCs be applied. You also observed that the stream that drains this pond system south to Trout Lake is not on our maps. VFM will ensure that the above noted AOCs will be updated to reflect the same level of protection as shown in the Term 1 approved plan. This protection will be part of the TL_AOC prescription. When the stream is located on site, the same level of protection will be applied to it.

3. <u>Copies of AOC prescriptions</u> were also requested for the DRL (Developed Lake), TL (Trout Lake), and TLR (Trout Lake Roads). It is my understanding that Ron Luopa has already emailed you a complete set of AOC prescriptions, as they were presented at the Public Information Centre. There will be no substantive changes made between now and the final plan submission.

Please note that the changes in our AOCs for Term 2 are a result of VFM applying the new required direction in the MNR – <u>Forest Management Guide for Conserving Biodiversity at the Stand and Site Scales (2010)</u>, and that these changes were applied in our automated GIS mapping. There was no intent by VFM to reduce previous levels of protection to Trout Lake, nor to cause any distress. Fortunately, the public consultation process is working as it should and you were able to point out your concerns and allow us opportunity to make changes.

You will find these changes incorporated in our Final plan submission (expected late September 2014).



Pileated Woodpeckers live at Trout Lake!

Appearance

The Pileated Woodpecker is slightly smaller than the American Crow. Their length ranges from 40cm to 49cm long, and they weigh between 250g to 350g. Overall, The Pileated Woodpecker's feathers appear black. The Pileated Woodpecker has a long tail that they use as brace when chiseling. Underneath their wings, they have white wing linings which are visible during flight and when a wing is extended. They have a white line that starts at the bill and runs across the cheek and down the neck. Both the male and female have the red crests.

Characteristics/Facts

- The Pileated Woodpecker was the inspiration for the cartoon character Woody Woodpecker.
- The Pileated Woodpecker is an "ecosystem engineer."
 Other Birds as well as Mammals depend on the cavities of the Pileated Woodpecker for survival. Also, other bird species feed from the excavations they create.
- It is the third largest woodpecker in North America. The Imperial Woodpecker and the Ivory-Billed Woodpecker are larger although they are generally considered extinct.
- Woodpeckers don't get headaches from pecking. They
 have reinforced skulls structured to spread the impact
 force, and their brains are tightly cushioned and
 protected. Between feeding, excavating nest cavities
 and <u>drumming</u>, woodpeckers can peck up to 20 times
 per second, or a total of 8,000-12,000 pecks per day.
- Northern birds tend to be larger in size than birds in southern populations.
- They sleep in roost cavities for the night, often in dead trees (snags). Each bird normally
 sleeps alone, one bird per roost. Although, on some occasions more than one bird occupied a
 roost. The roost trees they use have multiple entrance holes to provide alternate escape routes
 from predators. Roosting and nesting in cavities provides protection from the weather and from
 predators. The roost and nest cavities provide insulation for the Pileated Woodpecker.
- Predators of the Pileated Woodpecker include: Northern Goshawk, Cooper's Hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, Great Horned Owl, American Marten, Gray Fox, Barred Owl, Weasels, Squirrels, and the Black Rat Snake.
- Drumming is done by the Pileated Woodpecker to declare their territory. They drum by striking their bill on a hard surface such as a tree or utility pole. Drumming is done at 14.5-16.8 beats/second.
- Pileated Woodpeckers are monogamous, meaning, the stay with the same mate for life.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE REPORT—Bob Nikolic

Greetings to all campers! This AGM I volunteered for the Director Environment position. I believe most of you know that I have been very much involved in environmental issues facing our lake. It is a simple truth that if we damage our environment be it water, land, flora and fauna, all activities on the lake would be very negatively affected. Just a single blue-green algae bloom or major forest fire would change quality of life we enjoy now, forever, not to mention the impact on fishery, property values, etc.

I would like to thank Carol and Bill Munro, and Dave Moxham who took this year's phosphorus sample and secchi readings while my wife and I were on a long trip to Europe. It is the dedication of the members like these that keep our commitment to protect the environment. On that note we will continue our program of sampling and secchi readings on the lake. For about two years we had taken secchi readings every month from May to October and analysis of the results points out that for accurate results we just need to take a total of three readings two months apart: first in May when taking sampling for phosphorus, second in July and last in September. Our sampling record goes back to 1990 and it's probably the longest history of monitoring in the north. Based on this record, we know that by practicing strict environmental practices we can maintain our excellent water quality and surrounding area environment forever

If you need any information on environment, general or Trout Lake related, please feel free to contact me or the other environmental committee members. If we don't have an immediate answer, we will find it and get back to you.

OUR LAKE - OUR FUTURE

PLEASE KEEP SHORELINE ACCESS TO THE WATER AS SMALL AS POSSIBLE. Some municipalities are now mandating that 75% of the shoreline on each property must remain natural i.e. with native vegetation. The natural vegetation along shorelines feeds all the creatures in the riparian zone (along the edge of the shoreline in the water), and significantly affects the size of these species living there. The nutrients filter into the water and are food for fish, crayfish, insects, frogs, and so on. The vegetation also acts as a filter against soil and pollutants entering the lake. It can prevent your shoreline from eroding away. Cattails are one of Mother Nature's most effective filtering systems for pollutants.
