

Greetings fellow Trout Lakers: I'm writing this on Thanksgiving weekend. #### ENVIRONMENT & FORESTRY REPORT— Bob Nikolic, Director



Greetings to all Trout Lake Campers! The Summer finally arrived atTrout Lake at the beginning of September and it's still here! It's October 9 and the temperature is hovering around 20C but it won't last much longer - the forecast calls for two-three warm days before Fall temperatures set in. The Summer in the summer never happened, an inordinate amount of rain fell this year and the water never reached it's normal low level. We seem to get very unpredictable weather changes and I noticed that local radio station stopped giving three day forecast replaced by "today and tomorrow".

September turned out to be a very busy month on both environmental and forestry fronts. Guy Springay and I did the second secchi disc readings and will do third and final readings by the end of October. We have noticed that both the first and second readings showed lower values than last year's, which are most likely due to very high inputs of rain water bringing more silt to the lake. In that regard we would not be surprised that the third reading is also lower than normal.

A member from Edith Lake expressed concern with aerial spraying close to Edith Lake road but a considerable distance from the lake. Nevertheless, Doug Maki, VFM Silviculturist offered to have a meeting to make a thorough presentation on the issue. On September 4 two campers from Edith Lake and Guy Springgay and I went to the VFM office in Sudbury where we were given fairly detailed information about aerial spraying. We followed this with a field visit in the Killarney highway area. Many guestions were answered and the impression was that all reasonable precautions were taken during the spraying. We will need better warning signage in the sprayed area and more detailed tour of planned areas in order to make sure that as little harm as possible is done to environment. I have provided a detailed written report about this meeting to the Board and will email it to the campers that want to read it. In mid-September we received via VFM a request by Lahaie Lumber to allow an earlier than prescribed start on the access road on north side of Shaw road in vicinity of Pine Ridge road. According to the 2010-2020 Harvest Plan, no forestry related activity may take place between the May long weekend and the October long weekend, within one kilometer of the lake. We requested this clause in order to prevent operation noise and unsafe travel on lake access roads. Our approval would allow some workers to be meaningfully employed. Because the entrance was close to the Shaw road curve we were not fully satisfied with the road location but after requesting warning signage we approved the request. I also inspected other planned access roads in this area and will request some minor changes to entrances due to safety concerns. During this time I met with two concerned members from Pine Ridge Road and one afternoon had a field visit with them. They were satisfied with specific information about planned harvest and also general information about our relationship with VFM and the local logging companies.

At its last meeting this year the Board approved new members of the Environment and Forestry Committees. I am pleased that new members have replaced the members that could no longer serve. You will find this info on the Committee list in this Bulletin.

## FISHERY REPORT—Brian Smith

Hello all: I would like to offer a report on fisheries for the past year. Our rearing pond had its issues over this spring harvest. The MNRF is in the process of providing our fish habitat with larger and healthier Pickerel. Our volunteers will be commencing a pond clean up that will require rental equipment and many hours of labour. Our fisheries remain strong and challenging at the same time, although we expect 2018 to be our best to come.







# **LIGHTNING STRIKES!**

The thunderstorm of April 27 this year brought an unexpected surprise to one of our campers. Next door neighbor's on Cherriman Road heard a load bang and lightning flash simultaneously, and were waiting silently for a tree to come crashing down on them. Luckily nothing happened and the storm cleared in a few hours and off to bed they went.

The next morning they got up to survey for damage. Seeing nothing more that some downed branches, they decided to take a look at a few of their neighbor's as they knew they were out of town. More branches down everywhere but all roofs and buildings intact.

They were starting to head back when out of the corner of their eye they spotted a fire about the size of can of soup burning on the ground. They went to the fire and doused it out with lake water. The fire had been burning on plastic ABS pipe that was used to protect the satellite dish wires going into the house. About 30 feet of the pipe had burned throughout the night and luckily never ignited the pine needles on the ground or the trees near it.

When the burnt pipe was followed up to the point of origin they observed that a large area of the ground had been burned next to a tall Red Pine (see pictures).



Worried that a possible underground fire existed, the neighbors

called the Noelville Fire Department who came out to investigate. The firemen were amazed at what happened and were thankful the ground was so very wet from the storm or the whole area could have gone up in flames. Upon investigating the satellite dish and the pine tree they determined that the point of impact was a lightning strike at the top of the pine tree, which flowed down the tree where it found the best "ground" point – the satellite cable!



Luckily there was no major damage from this incident but it gives us more to consider after a lightning storm.

- 6 drops liquid smoke
- 2 sticks celery (halved)

Directions: Combine all ingredients in your slow cooker. I set up the roast with the bacon on top so the fat will add flavor to the roast.

Cook your roast covered for about 8 hours on low or until you reach your required doneness.

When done, remove from slow-cooker, let stand for 5-10 minute before cutting. If you don't do this all the juice will run out of the meat. Strain the ingredients from the slow cooker, and make your gravy add some potato water as you see fit.
