# ENVIRONMENT & FORESTRY REPORT Guy Springgay, Director

#### TAKE CARE OF THE ENVIRONMENT AND EVERYTHING ELSE WILL BE TAKEN CARE OF

Welcome campers to the start of another year at the lake. Looks like this will be another repeat of last year of keeping to ourselves to minimize risks.

I did the final set of Secchi readings last fall and the results for 2020 look favorable compared to 2019 year's results. All readings were sent to the *Lake Partners Program*. They are running behind this year and results will not be out until early June so I will report them in the Summer bulletin.

We did not do phosphorous and calcium testing in 2020 as the lab did not open until September. We do these chemical tests in the spring so we will do them as soon as I make it to camp and get our boat in the water.

The Board had approved doing additional new sampling for E.Coli Chlorophyll A, and Total Coliforms which will be done in the fall at various locations closer to the shore. Samples will be sent to a private testing lab in Sudbury.

We ask that all campers inspect their septic systems/field beds or holding tanks for any types of leaks to ensued there is no sewage (including grey water) seeping into the lake. This combined with lawn and garden fertilizers are the most important things we can do to keep green algae blooms out of our lake.

This winter I was fortunate to be able to participate in the 5 part zoom presentation on "Troubled Waters" held by The Greater Sudbury Watershed Alliance's. One of the many major issue they are working on is the increasing occurrences of blue green algae blooms associated with phosphorus levels - Blue-green algae are a significant threat to public safety.

- 1. Dr. John Gunn. Topic was Imagine Sudbury in 2050: A Global Change Community. Dr. Gunn discussed the City of Greater Sudbury's climate emergency declaration and commitment to being carbon neutral by 2050
- 2. Dr. Norman Yan spoke about widespread calcium decline in our lakes and sugar bushes and described a successful, citizen-based, restoration project response.
- 3. Dr. Sapna presented how the length of time a lake is frozen is a sensitive indicator of climate. She discussed how this information recorded over time documents changes in climate and how future climate changes will affect lakes around the world.
- 4. Dr. Andrea Kirkwood described a research co-production model involving local lake steward groups and associations that recognizes the value each partner brings to the design, collection, analysis and dissemination of water quality data.
- 5. Dr. John Smol presented research that leads to better understanding of the human impacts on aquatic ecosystems and better methods of understanding the effects of global warming thereby offering advice on improving lake management strategies.

#### Forestry update provided by Bob Nikolic.

This winter there was no harvest or log hauling in the vicinity of Trout Lake. None were scheduled in Annual harvest schedule but sometime this may be occurring if the circumstances warrant it and upon approval of MNRF. Needless to say this provided for very safe winter driving for permanent and seasonal campers. This year the Province has planned and approved a large scale aerial spruce bud worm spraying in Northeastern Ontario. The preliminary review of the areas slated for the spraying shows that none will occur anywhere near the lake so we will not be affected by this.

Just a reminder that from the end of May to the end of June there will be many turtles laying eggs on lake access roads, so please make sure you don't run over them.

I would like to thank all the volunteers on the Environment Committee and the Forestry Committee for all their help, suggestions and guidance. Please take a moment to take a look at the committee members named in the bulletin.

Please help keep our lake and lands clean.

#### SAFETY REPORT—Darryl Taylor

Thank you to the volunteers for your help with the fire pumps, markers and lights. The dedication of all of our behind the scenes marker and fire pump stewards is greatly appreciated.

Just a reminder that we had many safety complaints last summer. Please remember to boat responsibly. Be careful and cautious around swimmers, smaller vessels, animals, loons and cottagers personal property.

Fire hazards are currently listed as extremely high for the Greater Sudbury and West Nipissing areas. There was a fire which started May 15h west of Dodd Lake and we could smell the smoke. Please be careful with fire and follow the rules.

#### Winter at the Lake

Winter at Trout Lake was a little different this year. Some people who normally go south were forced to stay home, and therefore, a few more people chose to winter at Trout Lake. It was still very peaceful and quiet as there was little or no socializing. It's good to see a number of people out walking the road every day.

Our most active neighbours turned out to be moose, who seemed overly attracted to our area this winter. This resulted in some very interesting times. Moose tracks were everywhere along Cherriman Road, and through our yard, the neighbour's yard, and down the power line. We got a photo of one crossing in front on the ice.

As I would take the dog out every evening in the dark, we often heard the moose crashing through the bush nearby. This spooked the dog and me, and if he smelled the moose was close by, he'd bolt for the door. Other times, the dog would just point and stare off into the bush looking in some direction while I couldn't see a thing. One night we were out and a moose must have been very close. Suddenly out of the dark an unseen moose bellowed at us. This was enough to shake the trees and cause us to run indoors. The dog would have nothing to do with going out again that evening. Turns out by seeing the tracks in the morning it must have been only 20 feet away!

One of the moose had a calf which we saw on our game camera in early April. Since then, the moose have moved on or been hunted by wolves, as there was evidence of this along the road. It's nature's way, unfortunately.

Ice conditions weren't great this year—freeze-up came late for the snowmobilers and the ice conditions were slushy. Spring came very early with very high temperatures (+20 degrees) in March which resulted in a quick snow melt and the ice thawed around April 12th. Water levels were low but have come up a bit due to late April rains. This is good because the forest was very dry. We had only half of the normal snowfall this year, which could result in more forest fires. Partridge seem to be plentiful this year.



#### **Lake Development & Review Committee Report**

There have been some developments on the Happy Summer Village front over the past six months.

Earlier this year the developer demolished the older cabins on the property. It appears there are now a total of 6 park model trailers (**PMTs**) in use, some of which have been there since last year. One was recently installed close to the water on the east side of the property but apparently meets the setback requirements.

We were pleased to take notice of the report of the Sudbury East Planning Board (SEPB) dated March 19, 2021 submitted to Council, that indicated that the Municipality received legal advice that "Park Model Trailers are not Travel Trailers and could not be fit under the current definition of Travel Trailer in the Zoning By-law". This confirms the position that was advanced by the committee, as to the current non-compliance of any such use (including the current units which appear to be tolerated by the Municipality for the time being).

However, on April 7, Council resolved to direct staff to apply to the SEPB for a zoning bylaw amendment to add Park Model trailers as permitted uses in the WCT and CT zones. This is being proposed to be applied throughout the Municipality on an omnibus basis without exception. The general approach was described at Council as being "developer friendly".

This will engage a Zoning Bylaw amendment process that involves formal public input, which we hope will commence soon.

The committee continues to argue that any development at the easterly extremity of the lake must respect the provisions of the Provincial Policy Statement (**PPS**) and the Official Plan (**OP**) and be subject to all the best practices to ensure the protection of the lake and ecosystem.

The area in question is designated as "Rural" under the OP and as such "not identified to grow significantly" and the Municipality is to "protect significant and sensitive natural features and functions". It is the only such area, designated as "Rural" in the OP, that would be so affected by the proposed omnibus amendment.

Our concerns include the following:

- the lake is over capacity and has been frozen for development since 1977, as the only trout lake in the Municipality
- necessary studies, including environmental impacts and stormwater study ought to completed before development can proceed
- Protection of the lake ecosystem and reduction of negative environmental impacts, including the
  effects on the threatened specie Blanding Turtle, documented as nesting there, and the proximate
  pickerel spawning area

- Vegetated barriers to the lake and adjacent wintering grounds and wetlands
- There are also serious safety issues if there are numerous additional boats on a narrowest part of the lake.

One of the most significant issues is the scope of the proposed development. We understand that under the prior environmental compliance approval of the septic system there is a formula to determine that the existing maximum allowable capacity for cabins, lodge building and camper sites represented roughly the equivalent of 37 total "units" for all facilities including the main lodge facility which may account for several such units. This number is subject to change based on the septic system calculations determined by the number of units, showers, bathrooms, dishwashers, kitchens, etc., and the nature of the use of the ongoing main lodge facility and restaurant.

The committee is pleased to have been advised by officials that, for the time being at least, the development is proposed to be capped once septic capacity is reached. We are of the view that such limitation must be clearly stated in the amending zoning-bylaw. Otherwise, we lose our rights, as citizens, to object to any future expansion under the *Planning Act* and the related appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal (LPAT).

We are also of the view that the amendment to the Zoning Bylaw also requires amendment to the OP.

We are heartened by the professionalism and attention staff is giving to this matter, and the growing awareness and concern of Council. The "precautionary principle" established by the Supreme Court of Canada is applicable. As expressed by the words of David L. Lanthier in a recent LPAT decision, we must be concerned "with the long-term effects…not just for years to come, but for decades and centuries to come, as the PPS requires".

We will continue to watch this closely and engage constructively with the SEPB and the Municipality with the objective of resolving our concerns without the complexity and expense of an LPAT process.

I want to thank all the members of the committee for their diligence and dedication of their time and expertise to this issue. We welcome the support of all members of the Campers Association regarding this very concerning issue.





Hi Trout Lakers,

The snow has melted, the ice has thawed, the black flies are out & the fish are starting to get hungry! You know what that means, another season of open water fishing is upon us! With everyone getting so much 'indoor time' this winter & spring, I expect the water to be extra busy this year, please be mindful of everyone enjoying the water in their own way. Whether you love quiet morning kayak trips, lazy afternoon pontoon boat rides with friends, carving the water up with your water skis or reeling in the big one at dusk, there's plenty of water for everyone to enjoy safely & respectfully on beautiful Trout Lake... But please stay out of my favourite fishing spots;)

This year, in partnership with the MNRF & the TLCA, we'll be stocking 10,000 finger-lings into the lake. This is our first year stocking fingerlings versus fry's. For those that don't know, a fry is a newly born fish, about the length of a (natural) fingernail. After about 30-60 days they'll grow into a fingerling, about the length of our index finger. The work & cost involved is much higher with a fingerling, but the survival rate once put into our lake is dramatically higher than a fry... Is anyone else craving french fries now or is it just me?

That's it & that's all for this installment of the Fishery Report. Keep an eye out for our next report in June. Until then, stock up on bug spray and enjoy all the pleasures our lake has to offer.




Peacefully, Saturday, January 23rd, 2021 at Health Sciences North.


