

#### Happy Summer Fellow Campers

I hope everyone has been enjoying the great weather we have been having this summer. Thank you to all the volunteers who help with the markers,

lights and fire pumps. Your continued efforts are greatly appreciated. If any of our members would like to volunteer to assist with markers and general lake safety in the future please do not hesitate to contact me. We are always looking for new volunteers to assist. I would also like to give a friendly reminder to everyone to take some time to review the fire pump map provided in the bulletin and familiarize yourselves with the locations of fire pumps closest to your properties. Being in the middle of an emergency is not a good time to be trying to figure out where the nearest fire pump is located. For those of you that have a fire pump station on your property please take some time to test the pump and hoses in the coming weeks to make sure they are running well and no damage to the hoses. If any pumps are not running or if parts are missing or hoses are damaged, please contact me for replacements.

This summer I have been receiving a lot of reports of irresponsible boaters on the lake putting people and wildlife at risk. There are a handful of boats which I have received numerous complaints about from different members. This is a friendly reminder to PLEASE watch your speed near shorelines and tight narrows. I have had several reports of boats passing through narrows at full speed, boats running over loons and some close calls with swimmers and kayakers nearly being struck. Please do not assume that wildlife on the lake such as loons will move out of the way of your boat in time. We have already lost a few this year to irresponsible boaters. There is NO REASON to be traveling full speed close to shore or in narrow areas of the lake. If you cannot see what is ahead of you then please slow down. High speed boat traffic should be traveling down the middle of the lake away from shorelines and away from swimmers, kayakers and pets. Ontario regulations dictate that a province-wide-shoreline speed restriction of 10 km\h within 30 meters of shore is in effect whether posted or not. These regulations can be enforced by OPP, MNR and the MTO resulting in possible fines and boater's license suspension. If any of our members witness irresponsible boaters participating in dangerous activities on the lake I would encourage you to write down the boat registration number (if you can see it) and call the local police to submit a complaint as our campers association has limited authority to do anything about these dangerous habits.

Should anyone have safety concerns or would like to report lost/damaged markers and other safety equipment please do not hesitate to contact me. I hope everyone enjoys the rest of their summer take advantage of the great weather we are having late in the season because before you know it the snow will be flying. For those of you who enjoy our lake year round see you out on the ice! If you spot a black snowmobile towing a blue ice hut don't hesitate to stop and say hi. I

might even be kind enough to share some my secrets for those trophy fish!

#### **People Polluting Trout Lake**

I've received an appalling report about people disrespecting the environment around Trout Lake.

Apparently a group of people have been using the old government landing site on the north shore as a free campground. There have been ongoing issues with them building fire pits in the roadway, blocking the ramp, leaving garbage strewn about and causing havoc.

The latest report is that someone dumped their sewage directly into Trout Lake. The issue has been brought forward to Ministry of Northern Development, Mines and Natural Resources. The Ministry has decided to post "No Camping" signs.

If anyone has any information about this matter, including names of the campers there, license plates, photos, please come forward and share the information.

If partying is an issue there, report it to the OPP. We need to act in unison to make it very uncomfortable for people to remain there, who are disrespecting Trout Lake.

In addition, we all should know that it is illegal under the Public Lands Act to camp at access points.

On a separate matter, on June 27th, I received a report of a dead moose floating in the lake along the north shore west of the power lines in a bay where there is a beaver lodge. This issue was also reported to MNR and they opted to take no action, saying they prefer to "let nature take it's course". This does nothing to ensure the safety of the water supply for those who draw from the lake, nor prevent someone from running into it with a boat. The stench is horrible and the environmental effects…I haven't heard lately, but I imagine it is gone, sunk, eaten…

With the summer in full swing, I was thrilled to start lake monitoring programs and help gain a better understanding about the lake's health and ecosystem.

My family camp on Trout Lake has always been a special place for me growing up; full of wonderful memories and a place where I could get away and recharge. Throughout my time observing, exploring and enjoying the lake, I have formed connections to the land,

water and the wildlife that call it home. These connections, appreciation and love for Trout Lake are the reasons I help to protect the lake. I'm honoured to share my passion for nature and offer my skillset in environmental biology for Trout Lake.

#### **Ongoing and New Lake Monitoring Programs**

The Trout Lake Camper's Association has been participating in FOCA's Lake Partner Program since 1992. The goal of the Lake Partner Program is to "better understand and protect the quality of Ontario's inland lakes by involving citizens in a volunteer-based water quality monitoring program". Water samples are taken every spring and water clarity measurements are completed in the spring, summer and occasionally in the early fall. Results are shared on FOCA's website (https://foca.on.ca/lake-partner-program-sampling-assistance/). Stay tuned for results from 2021.

This summer the TLCA participated in NEW community science programs to help collect additional data on lake health. Volunteers across Trout Lake, and Canada, took part in Living Lakes Canada's National Lake Blitz program to collect community science data for a 'snapshot' of Canadian freshwater lakes; looking at temperature, water colour, shoreline health, plants, wildlife and invasive species. The program encourages the widespread monitoring of lakes across Canada using simple tools so participants can easily understand the impacts of climate change on freshwater lakes.

We also collected plankton and eDNA samples as part of the IsampleON Program by the Invasive Species Centre and FOCA. This program helps to detect the presence of aquatic invasive species in lakes and fill data gaps to manage the spread of invaders. Results from the program will be posted on https://FOCA.on.ca/isampleon/.

#### Stop the spread of invasive species, new Ontario regulations for watercrafts

"Many ecological, economical, and recreational impacts have been observed in North America due to the introduction of invasive species. The importance of preventing the spread of these species cannot be stressed enough. The active participation of boaters, anglers, shoreline property owners and other recreational water users is vital to prevent the spread of these invaders. Our efforts today will benefit the aquatic ecosystems of tomorrow as well as contribute to our continued enjoyment of the benefits it provides." (IsampleON Program)

Watercrafts are a major carrier of invasive species, and Ontario's new regulations allow us to better prevent and slow their spread using **Clean, Drain, Dry** practices.

- Boaters are now required to remove drain plugs, drain all on board water and remove any aquatic plants upon removing the watercraft from a waterbody.
- · Prior to reaching a launch site for a body of water, the watercraft, watercraft equipment and any vehicle or trailer used to transport the watercraft or watercraft equipment must not have an aquatic plant, animal or algae attached to it. Note: watercraft includes any motorboat, rowboat, canoe, punt, sailboat, or raft.

#### Species at risk bats live on Trout Lake

Did you know that Trout Lake is home to various species at risk? One of these species includes an endangered bat known as the Little Brown Bat. Bats in Canada are strictly insectivores and play a large role in controlling insect populations. On average 1 bat can eat 600 insects in an hour. In Ontario, there are 8 species of bats and 3 are listed as "endangered" species which means they are at risk of becoming extinct. This is mainly due to habitat loss and the spread of a fungus that causes White-Nose Syndrome which can cause populations to decline by 90-100%. One way to help conserve bats is to report sightings to the Neighbourhood Bat Watch https://batwatch.ca.

#### Notice of Inspection of Approved Aerial Herbicide Project Plan Sudbury Forest

The Ontario Ministry of Northern Development, Mines, Natural Resources and Forestry have provided notice to inspect the approved aerial herbicide project for Sudbury Forest. Selected stands on the Sudbury Forest will be sprayed with herbicide to control competing vegetation, starting on or about August 15, 2022. **This includes a stand on the north east end of Trout Lake along Lafreniere Road.** Information can be obtained electronically on the Natural Resources Information Portal https://nrip.mnr.gov.on.ca/s/fmp-online.

# WINE TIMES volume 1

By Lise Gagne

Welcome to a 12 volume introduction into wine. The intent is to provide basic information to allow you to explore the Wide World of Wine (WWW). I have had to opportunity to invest into some formal training with the Wine and Spirit Education Trust (WSET) and it has allowed me to broaden my love of wine beyond just drinking Cab! I absolutely love watching people explore wine and food pairings. The world of wine can be overwhelming, seem intimidating and snobby but it doesn't need to be that way! Let's start exploring! Volume

1 is a simple little primer to get us going!

#### How do you "TASTE" wine?

4 Steps (yes you can do it vs quaffing wine J)

Appearance

Palate

Nose

Finish

The 6 S's! Yes, it's SIMPLE

See

Swirl

Sniff

Sip

Swish

Savor



From my experience leading tasting groups most people don't really care about the Appearance but the taste is important. Surprisingly the most important part is the smell, are you surprised? Well I was so now I take the time to swirl and sniff all my wine to better understand what I like and what I don't like. That guided me to understanding the tags at the LCBO, for example Cassis as a characteristic sounded jazzy but I discovered I don't actually like wines with that characteristic. We can dive into characteristics and Wine Traits in the next volumes but for now let's stick to the basics and a few other simple things you can do to help develop your sense of smell and internal systems to grasp primary aromas and flavors and lock them into your brain!

#### Sniffing "Smelling" basics

In the WWW hundreds of aromas exist! We just don't really pay attention to them, understanding what these aromas are and "locking" them into our brains is a very helpful strategy for understanding what aromas we like and what we don't like. All this makes buying wine SO MUCH EASIER!

Have the right glass! Your granny's glass is not going to help you here! Drinking from a water cup or snifter is not the right choice! Sorry I said wine was not snobby! Seriously though having a good glass is really important. You do not need to spend a fortune on wine glasses here either. I always recommend getting the Riedel Magnum Ouverture glasses. They are a universal glass that can be used for any wine and if you have gone to any wineries they are often used. They have a shorter stem too that helps prevent tipping or breaking. You can buy them online or locally at Popes and they are available in multiple unit packs that I highly recommend. Why is this important? A good glass allows the aromas to come out vs get "knocked back" down into the glass from a bulky inner ridge. There have been many studies conducted to demonstrate the effectiveness of a well-designed glass but the main conclusions have shown that a glass with a large bowl and enough room in the glass to allow oxygen contact to enhance the aroma of the wine. Many wine specific glasses exist and I have a massive amount of them but in general I keep going back to the ones I recommended with the intent of having a universal great glass. It gets really fun to do parallel tastings in the same glass too!!

Smelling tips


Take a quick sniff to prime up those senses. Position your nose above the glass to start and move into the glass until you pick up individual smells

Swirl the wine, the best way is to swirl it on a solid surface to avoid splashing

Take some delicate sniffs and take time to pause and think, repeat. See point 1 for nose position Start with identifying fruit smells also known as Primary Aromas.

#### **Tasting Basics**

Flavors are detected (perception of flavor) by Retronasal Action. Now we are on the Geek Street! Tasting has allot to do with smelling, YEP! Smelling wine is the most important part of tasting wine. WHY?? Orthonasal and Retronasal Olfaction! Let's dig deeper into this, hey it might make you want to go back to quaffing wine but I will risk it! I love the image taken from Wine Folly (one of my go to simple resources, see resource list at the end).



Orthonasal – external sense when you put your nose in the glass Retronasal – internal sense, inside the mouth commonly known as reverse smell

Cool uh! How do I do it?

This process is somewhat like chewing the wine. I call it wine yoga breathing HAHA!

Take a medium size sip of wine

Swish it in your mouth so the wine touches all the nooks in the mouth

Swallow or spit it out

Take a slow breath through the mouth and then exhale through the nose
