I'm writing to provide you with information about Local Targeted Fisheries Monitoring the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) Sudbury District will be conducting in 2023.

Starting August 21, MNRF science crews will be setting nets on Trout Lake. In 2008 the MNRF began a long-term fisheries program, known as broad-scale monitoring program. The broad-scale monitoring program is designed to monitor current and changing state of fisheries across Ontario's inland lakes. Information collected is used to evaluate the health of fish populations and inform management decisions for Fisheries Management Zones (FMZ).

Trout Lake has not been surveyed as part of the Broadscale Monitoring Program and is being surveyed for Local Targeted Monitoring. The goal of this project will be to assess the success of Lake Trout and Walleye stocking in the lake. MNRF Sudbury District crews will use the Broadscale Monitoring protocol to collect information on the fish community.

Netting on each lake will take approximately 1.5 to 2 weeks to complete. While the lake is being assessed, nets are checked and moved daily to new locations and all nets are clearly marked with MNRF buoys. Please do not lift the nets or buoys and avoid recreational activities between and around the buoys. Notices will be posted at various locations on the lake, such as public boat launches, while netting is underway.

SHORT-TERM RENTAL ACCOMMODATIONSNotice Of Public Consultation On Proposed Short-Term Rental Licensing By-Law

The Municipality of French River is seeking feedback from the residents, community, visitors and businesses on the proposed Short-Term Rental Licensing By-law.

Council is moving to a licensing program to balance the economic benefits of short-term rentals, address community concerns and to ensure the safety of operators, renters and neighbours so that everyone may have an enjoyable experience in French River.

WHAT IS A SHORT-TERM RENTAL?

A Short-term rental (STR) is all or part of a dwelling unit rented out for less than 30 consecutive days. STR accommodations are commonly offered through online platforms such as Airbnb, Vrbo and Kijiji.

BACKGROUND

In 2021, Council showed an interest in managing STRs in our Municipality. This was followed by reports presented at meetings held on February 2, 2022, April 5, 2023, and July 5, 2023, where Council discussed frameworks to license and regulate short-term rentals in detail.

The proposed licensing by-law includes provisions such as:

- limit of 50 licences throughout the Municipality and one licence per property
- permitted in all zones that permit a residential dwelling
- limit of rental occupants based on septic capacity
- require that a designated responsible person be assigned to respond within specific timeframes
- enforcement tools such as fines and demerit points

To regulate Short Term Rentals (STR), the Zoning By-law requires a general amendment to define a short-term rental accommodation and to regulate them through licensing. The Public Hearing to consider the Zoning By-law Amendment will be held on November 1, 2023. For more information go to www.frenchriver.ca


